Payment and Registration: Payment, in full, is due upon registration. Payment includes the camp fee as well as any materials fee or computer lab fee. You may mail your paper registration form with a check or money order, made payable to Temple University. We regret that we cannot accept credit card payments by mail. Cash is also not an acceptable form of payment.

Early Bird Discount: Register and pay by March 31, 2018 and take \$50 off each camp fee, unless otherwise noted that discounts do not apply. Discount is not taken off the materials or computer lab fee. Early bird discount can be combined with one of the other discount options below.

Multi-Session Discount: Save 10% when registering your child for 3 or more full-day, one-week (5-day) camp sessions, at the time of registration, unless noted that discounts do not apply.

OR

Sibling Discount: Save 10% for each child attending a full-day, one-week (5-day) camp, during the same week, unless noted that discounts do not apply.
